FAQs

What are the CAP State and Federal PACs?

The Cooperative of American Physicians, Inc. State and Federal Political Action Committees (PACs) are voluntary, bipartisan political organizations that advocate on behalf of its physician members to protect access to care, MICRA, and medical professional liability reform. The PACs are solely dedicated to promoting the interests of its members in both the California State Legislature and the United States Congress.

Are contributions to the PACs tax-deductible?

No.

May I use a corporate check when giving to either of the PACs?

Federal law prohibits using corporate checks for federal PACs. You may, however, use a corporate check to contribute to state PACs.

What happens to the funds the PACs receive?

One hundred percent of our Federal PAC funds are used to help elect candidates for public office. On the state side, funds are allocated to candidate contributions, patient safety, access to care, and advocacy efforts.
